



Update on the PSEA session during the Humanitarian Coordinators' retreat 31 May 2016

From 31 May to 1 June, 35 Humanitarian Coordinators were joined by senior officials from IASC partner agencies, representatives from donor governments, and public and private partners at the 2016 Humanitarian Coordinators' Retreat in Montreux, Switzerland.

The annual HC Retreat provides an opportunity for substantive exchange between HCs and key humanitarian stakeholders. The Retreat is a good occasion to share global messages and updates on global initiatives, to receive feedback from HCs on critical issues, and to 'ground truth' potential responses and policy.



Summary

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 57/306, the present report provides data on allegations of sexual exploitation and abuse in the United Nations system for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2015 and information on measures being taken to strengthen the Organization's response to sexual exploitation and abuse in the areas of prevention, enforcement and remedial action.



Contribution to objective 2.1 of our workplan : support to operationalization of AAP and PSEA

Several countries have been reaching out to the task team to get help when setting up PSEA network at country level

The HC has appointed UNFPA as a Lead coordinating agency for PSEA Iraq Network, and WFP AAP advisor has taken a co-lead position.

- first meeting with all UN PSEA Focal points, which are taking on the task on top of their other responsibilities
- draft TORs and Work plan for the next 6 months : no funding request
 - IDP call centre and other field level mechanisms work as complaint lodging mechanisms
 - Victim protection and assistance handled by the GBV sub cluster's victim assistance response mechanism
 - relies on investigation carried out by individual agency
- Objective to expand to non UN stakeholders

Funding?
