

Inter-Agency Humanitarian Evaluation (IAHE) of the collective response to the Earthquakes in TÜRKIYE/SYRIA

March 2024



In line with IASC protocols, the Emergency Relief Coordinator launched this mandatory inter-agency humanitarian evaluation. It will:

- Provide an independent assessment of the collective response of IASC member agencies in meeting the humanitarian needs of communities affected by the earthquakes in Türkiye and Syria in February 2023.
- Promote strategic learning for the humanitarian system.
- Foster accountability towards affected populations, the IASC and donors.
- Assist the humanitarian coordination mechanisms to strengthen the response.

The evaluation questions will focus on the successes, challenges and lessons learned of the IASC's collective humanitarian response:

- To what extent did the IASC member agencies' collective **preparedness and response efforts prove relevant and timely** in meeting the demands of the crisis and the humanitarian needs caused by it?
- To what extent was the IASC members' collective response **coherent and well-coordinated**?
- To what extent were the IASC members' collective efforts able to **effectively respond** to the humanitarian crisis in Türkiye and Syria?
- To what extent can the IASC member agencies' collective response be considered **equitable and inclusive**?

METHODS



Conducted by an **independent** evaluation team



Interviews, field visit, focus group discussion, observation, desk review



Mixed-methods design, collecting primary data combined with analysis of secondary data and documents
