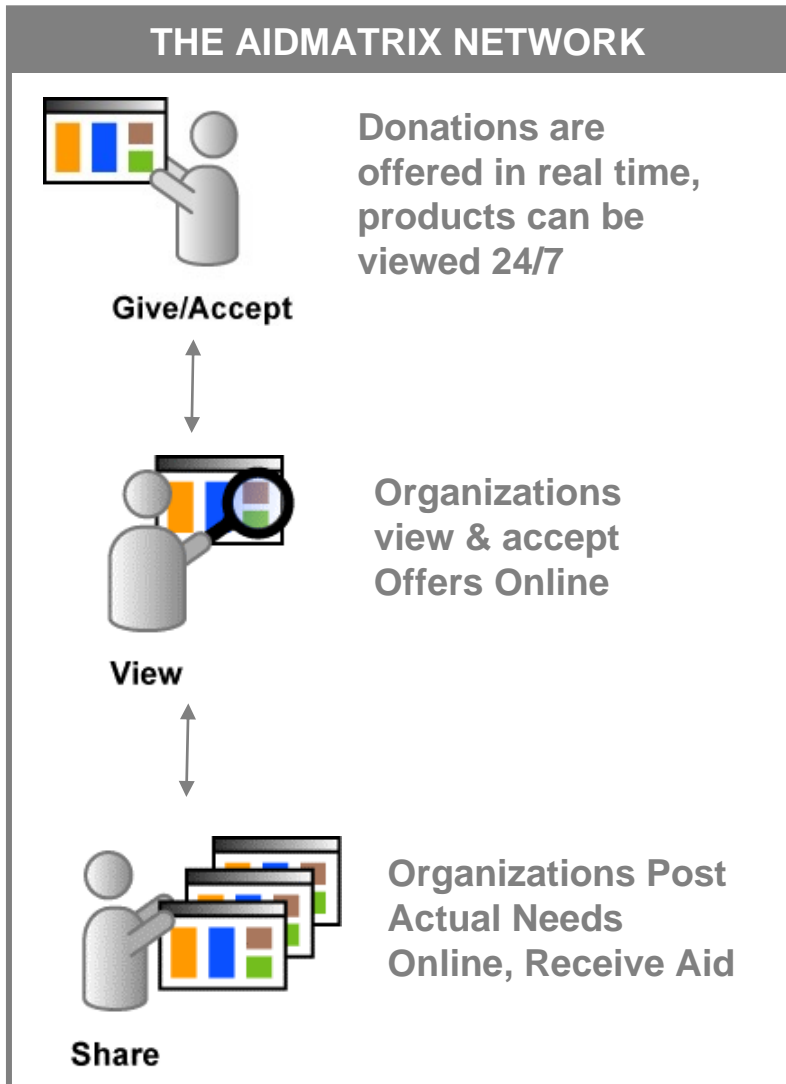

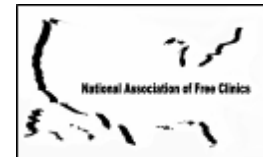

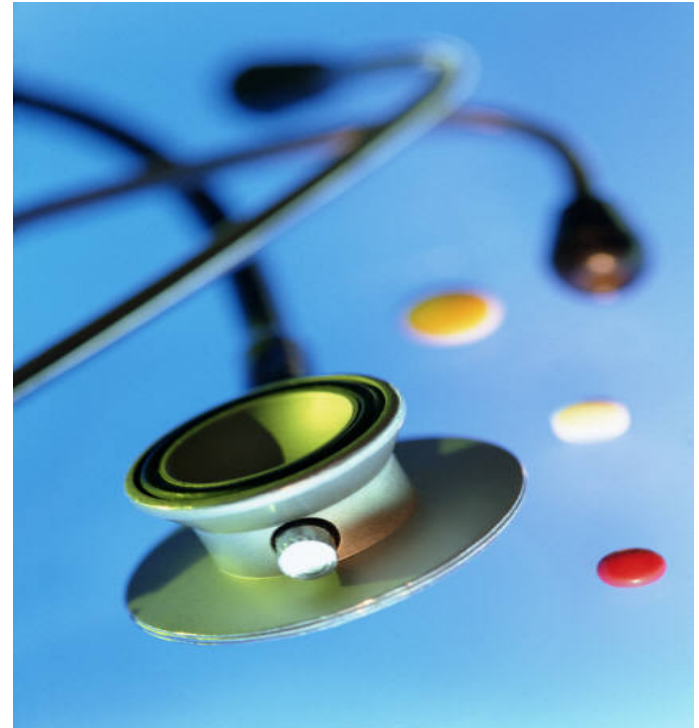
Hunger Relief Exchange

Medical Relief Exchange

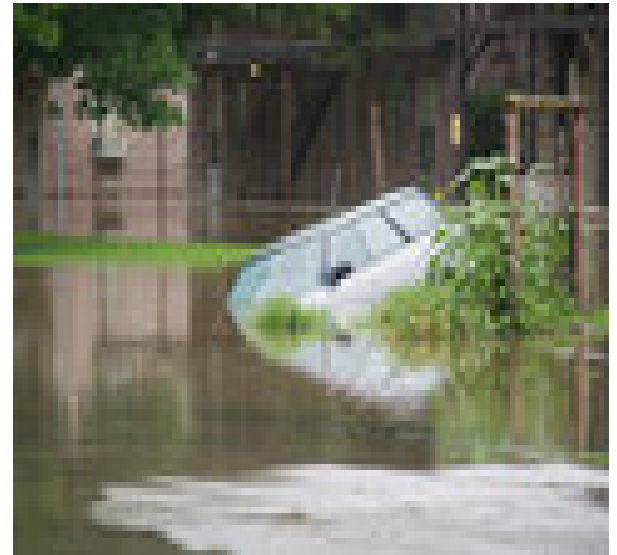
- ◆ Aidmatrix supplies an Internet-based system for surplus, discounted and donated medicine & health-related products totaling more than \$50 Million annually

Disaster Relief Case Study: FEMA Program

- ◆ National Donations Management Portal
- ◆ Part of FEMA website and links to other websites / portals
 - ◆ FEMA
 - ◆ States
 - ◆ UPS
- ◆ Investment Summary
 - ◆ >\$25 million Software/Services Donated Up Front
 - ◆ ~\$5 million other Grants and Industry Donations
 - ◆ ~\$3 Million Payment from FEMA
- ◆ Donors offer aid
 - ◆ Products
 - ◆ Services
 - ◆ Financial
 - ◆ Donors have real-time tracking of their donations
- ◆ Agencies post needs
 - ◆ Charities and other Relief Agencies
 - ◆ Needs seen by those interested in assisting
 - ◆ Potential Donors can see needs, real-time

Disaster Relief Case Study: Republic of Honduras

- ◆ National Donations Management Portal, similar to USA FEMA
- ◆ Differences
 - ◆ More focus on International Aid Coordination
 - ◆ Multiple Language Capability
 - ◆ Daily Relief and Disaster
 - First Lady's Office (Daily Relief)
 - COPECO – National Disaster Agency
 - ◆ Phase II: Coordination/ Registration of all Incoming Emergency Aid Shipments enabling Port Expedition
 - ◆ Integration with SUMA relief system
