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


### Context

- Chronic and acute food insecurity and malnutrition crisis
- Conflict and rebellion in the North
- Political crisis in the South
- mutually reinforcing vulnerabilities


### **Humanitarian Needs**

- 4.6 million people food insecure
  - 1.84 million severely food insecure pre-crisis
  - 1.13 million moderately food insecure
  - 1.63 million severely food insecure in North
- SAM of 175,000 and MAM of 385,000
  - Over 80% of the caseload in the South
- 500,000 children at risk of abandoning school
- Complicating factors:
  - Access to WASH (<44%) and Health (<60%)</li>
  - Increase of food and decrease of livestock prices
  - Conflict and political crisis



### **Humanitarian Needs**

- 2.xx million people living in conflict affected areas
- 200,000 refugees (240,000 projected)
- 167,000 IDPs (200,000 projected)
  - Large part in host families
- Quasi absence of state structures
  - Water, sanitation, health, education...
- Food price rise by up to 200%



# **CAP / CHAP - 4 Strategic Objectives**

- Reduce mortality, morbidity and vulnerability of individuals and communities affected by the food and nutrition crisis.
- Improve living conditions and protection of people and communities affected by conflict.
- Contribute to strengthening and preserving the livelihoods and resilience of people and communities affected by humanitarian crises.
- Reinforce humanitarian space and strengthening impartial and adequate humanitarian preparation and response.
