"The Whistleblower" is a critically-lauded thriller starring Rachel Weisz as an American police officer who takes a job as a peacekeeper in post-war Bosnia. A fictionalized account that is inspired by actual events, the movie deals with issues that are both real and abhorrent: human trafficking, violence against women and cross-border organized crime. United Nations peacekeepers and staff are portrayed as turning a blind eye to, or worse, actually being complicit in these crimes.
