What is the IASC?

- Unique inter-agency forum involving the key UN and non-UN humanitarian partners for:
 - coordination
 - policy development
- Established in June 1992 in response to GA Resolution 46/182 on the strengthening of humanitarian assistance
- GA Resolution <u>48/57</u> affirmed the role of the IASC as the "primary mechanism for interagency coordination of humanitarian assistance"
- IASC led by the Emergency Relief Coordinator

Objectives of the IASC

Dialogue

» Forum for humanitarian dialogue among humanitarian actors

Policy-development

» System wide policies and humanitarian guidelines for humanitarian operations

Advocacy

» Platform for the humanitarian community to advocate collectively for common principles and values

Operational discussions and decision-making

» For the humanitarian community to articulate crisis-specific strategies



Structure of the IASC

IASC Principals

- o Executive level, chaired by the ERC
- o Meets two times a year and ad-hoc
- o Strategic decisions or policy issues



IASC Working Group

- o Senior representatives of the organisations chaired by the Director OCHA Geneva
- o Meets 3 times a year and ad-hoc
- o Provides policy support to the Principals based on field needs and realities
- o Identifies emerging issues



- **IASC Subsidiary Bodies**
- o **Technical and policy officers**, for technical recommendations to the IASC-WG

IASC Secretariat

o Assists different IASC bodies; monitors work to IASC Subsidiary bodies and implementation of IASC decisions



Subsidiary Bodies

established for an unlimited duration to address critical on-going priority issues

Sub-Working Groups

Reference Groups

self-managed "communities of practice" with loose affiliation to the IASC Task Forces

established for a limited duration to complete a specific task

Current priorities

- 1. IASC Principals meeting in December 2010 initiated a "transformational" process to improve the quality of the humanitarian system to respond to emergencies by:
 - 1. Strengthening Leadership and Coordination
 - 2. Improving Accountability for Performance
 - 3. Improving Accountability to Affected People
 - 4. Building Capacity for Preparedness in selected countries
 - 5. Improving Advocacy and Communication
- Initiative to make the work of the IASC Working Group and Subsidiary Bodies more effective -> reduction to 11 IASC Subsidiary Bodies




