<u>Objective</u>: Review the current crisis in Liberia and the sub-region, and propose strategies to strengthen agency response.

- ♦ Key Issues:
 - protection of civilians/IDPs
 - common inter-agency fundraising strategy
 - common inter-agency information campaign
 - contingency planning

<u>Proposed outcome</u>: Agreement on follow up actions to address funding shortfalls, misinformation, and steps to strengthen protection of civilians. Identify country-level follow-up.

15:30 – 16:30 h Allegations of Sexual Exploitation of Refugee Children in West Africa

The recent debate on the allegation of sexual exploitation by humanitarian workers in West Africa will be introduced.

<u>Objective</u>: Recommend modalities for a coordinated and systemwide response to prevent and protect vulnerable populations from sexual abuse and exploitation.

Key issues:

- remedial action needed to be taken immediately regarding the allegations of sexual exploitation
- weaknesses in procedures and what measures are needed to address them
- coordination of the system-wide response

Proposed outcome:

 Agreement on follow-up actions to address the issues of sexual exploitation of refugee children and other vulnerable populations

17:00 - 18:30 h **Afghanistan**

Mr. Ross Mountain, Director OCHA Geneva, will introduce the discussion.

<u>Objective</u>: review existing gaps in coordination and assistance and suggest measures to address the gaps.

Key issues:

- what are the appropriate linkages between the humanitarian operations and the Interim Authority of Afghanistan, including UN and non-UN partners, as well as between the humanitarian operations and the multinational force?
- how should NGOs interface with UNAMA to ensure that their neutrality was not impeded?
- what needs to be done to address immediately the humanitarian crises in the more remote regions where food insecurity remains grave and social services nonexistent?
- should agencies be doing more to address the issue of the "gap" between relief and development?
- what additional measures should be done to ensure adequate staff security?

<u>Proposed outcome:</u> The IASC WG discussion would flag issues of urgent concern to the DSRSG and the Country Team, and to suggest broad guidelines for how some of these concerns should be addressed.
