Preparations for the Humanitarian Coordinators' Retreat: Background Note

#### **Background**

The 2003 Humanitarian Coordinators' Retreat is scheduled to take place on 20 to 22 November. The retreat will follow the CAP launch, scheduled to take place on 18-19 November.

With regard to preparations, a HCs' Retreat Task Force has been established within OCHA. As a fist step, the task force has set out to develop the retreat's objectives and agenda for discussion.

Based on discussion and recommendations stemming from last year's Retreat, a list of possible objectives and agenda items has been drawn up and is presented hereunder.

A round of consultations with HCs has been initiated to seek their feedback and suggestions. In the same vein, the IASC-WG is invited to discuss possible key issues of concern that could be purposefully addressed at the upcoming HCs' Retreat.

## **Possible Objectives of the Retreat**

- 1. To obtain the HCs' experience and views on their needs and priorities in the discharge of their mandate,
- 2. To provide a forum for HCs to gain a fuller understanding of the support available to them in the exercise of their functions,
- 3. To facilitate the exchange of information among HCs and between HCs, OCHA and IASC members on key humanitarian challenges, with a view at promoting cross-fertilisation of experiences and lessons learned,
- 4. To deepen the knowledge of HCs on specific issues relevant to their mandate and to consolidate earlier dialogue and interventions with partners in the field.

## **Possible Agenda Items for Discussion:**

- Review and Lessons Learned of the 2004 CAP Launch
- Humanitarian Financing
- Civil and Military Liaisons: A Year in Review (Afghanistan, Iraq, Liberia, etc.)
- HC Role and Support--(a) HC ToR, (b) IDPs, (c) Strengthening human rights-related action at country level, and (d) HIV/AIDS and the role of the HCs.
- Security Issues: training, lessons learned, update from UNSECOORD
- □ Advocacy and Media Relations (proposed training)
- □ Transition Issues
- □ Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (as recommended by the IASC WG at the July meeting)
- □ Health Action in Crisis
- □ Strengthening Field Information Management in Support of Coordination

## **Expected Decisions/Action Points by the IASC-WG:**

To consider and provide views on the possible objectives and agenda items for the 2003 Humanitarian Coordinators' Retreat with a view of reaching a preliminary agreement on the above.
