- May 2016: Topic of SHA discussed at HC Retreat
- December 2016: IASC Principals discuss issue and agree on two co-champions; Kate Gilmore – OHCHR and Lindsay Coates - InterAction
- March 2017: IASC Zero Tolerance Statement Issued
- March – May 2017: IASC Co-champions conduct listening campaign with relevant actors including Report the Abuse, Humanitarian Women’s Network and Ambassador Bill Swing.
- May 2017: 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of IASC Sr. Focal Points on Prevention of Sexual Harassment and Abuse held
- August 2017: Sr. Focal Points submit organizational response and compliance with checklist.

# Next Steps

- Review and discuss submissions from IASC Sr. Focal Points on checklist.
- Identify existing gaps which could be addressed through work of Sr. Focal Points versus those gaps which are internal to organizations.
- InterAction will be convene a meeting of relevant stakeholders in the Fall to determine how it can better support and improve member's existing policies and procedures.
