But....

- **X** Progress remains uneven;
- X High transaction costs for <u>as yet</u> relatively limited returns;
- **X** 'Quid pro quo' is still not functional;
- X Progress at technical level but limited political dialogue to resolve challenges.





How to maximise the potential of the Grand Bargain?

Adopt a <u>strategic</u> approach to:

- Address or better navigate remaining challenges; and
- **I** Exploit opportunities and scale up successes



Navigate the challenges, barriers and bottlenecks that are stalling progress:

- Insufficient progress on provision of more flexible funding;
- ▼ The impact of (increased) compliance requirements;
- Linking better quality needs analyses with more principled resource allocations.



Expand, scale-up, build upon the successes achieved to date:

- Localisation: focus on the *quality* of investments in local/national partners;
- Enhanced quality funding: use the funding that is available more *strategically*;
- Marmonised reporting: upscale from a pilot to standard practice.
