CAPACITY

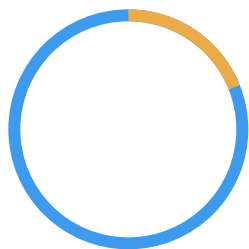
Scaling up technical support to country programmes within agencies and across the system to accelerate nexus approaches for better coordination, programming and financing

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the end of the Nexus training, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate a shared understanding of the HDP nexus concept
- Define the rationale for accelerating Nexus approaches
- Describe the role of different stakeholders in supporting nexus approaches
- Identify strategic entry-points for Nexus approaches
- Identify opportunities for advancing cross-portfolio initiatives and complementary solutions to programming
- Demonstrate practical skills and apply tools for coordination, programming and financing to advance nexus programming
- Determine linkages and systems that need to be created to offer joined-up global, regional and local support for nexus related policy, partnerships, processes and programmes
- Engage in 'community', knowledge exchange and support networks
- Explain specific roles and opportunities in accelerating Nexus approaches

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LEARNING DESIGN

- **Individual learning** — self-paced tools and exercises
- **Social learning** — live, interactive tools like experience sharing sessions, group exercises, group discussions and plenary reflections
- **Role-based and problem-solving approach** — for exercises and discussions, to enable participants use of learning time and inputs for action-based learning
- **Real-life examples and model scenarios** — nexus challenges and opportunities will be introduced to from beginning to end, identifying pitfalls and solutions along the way
- **Narrative** — related to leadership, behavior and systems change will be woven in across modules
- Course will allow for **real-time adaptation**
- **Virtual Learning platform and tools** — MS Teams, MURAL, EasyGenerator and Zoom — with real-time tech support

TIME COMMITMENT

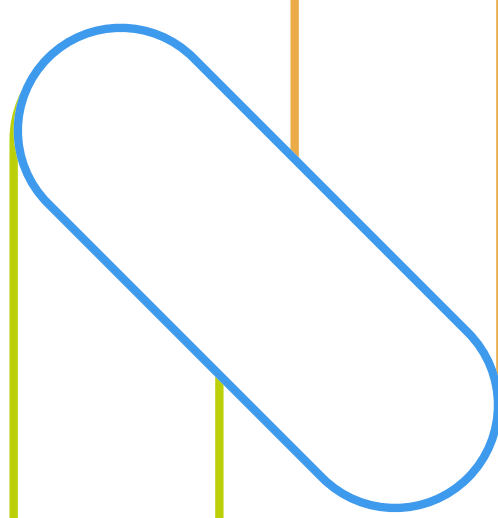
Participation is required for 8 hours per week for 6 weeks. Through a mix of self-taught & social learning, participants must attend at least nine of the twelve modules to earn certificate.
