### **COVID-19 and Internal Displacement**

### **Messages and Resources**

There is a wealth of useful information, guidance, news items and reports on COVID-19. The purpose of this document is to compile suggestions of resources that can be useful for stakeholders working on internal displacement. It is not a comprehensive collection, but rather a selection.

These messages and resources are compiled by GP20 partners for their and others' use in communications on the COVID-19 pandemic and internal displacement. All users of this document should feel free to strengthen, add and suggest revisions to these messages as the situation evolves.

#### Messages

- IDPs can be at heightened risk of contracting COVID-19 where they live in crowded conditions with limited access to water and where health care facilities are at low capacity
- Not all IDPs are vulnerable in the same way to COVID-19. They have different needs, live in a range of settlement types and face varying degrees of access to services
- COVID-19 may disproportionally and negatively affect IDPs economically if measures to fight the virus result in loss of income, restricted movement, reduced access to markets and land, and rise in prices
- IDPs should be included in national plans to combat COVID-19, including access to information, testing and treatment
- Governments should receive additional support to ensure IDPs are not left behind in preparedness and response to COVID-19 crisis
- Host countries and local communities need international support to strengthen health facilities and ensure the pandemic does not have disproportionate impacts on certain individuals or groups
- Some IDPs are experiencing increased sexual and domestic violence as a result of confinement, isolation and loss of income (this is from the UNHCR COVID protection messages, not sure what the data source is for this)
- Efforts are required to enhance community awareness and understanding of the COVID-19 pandemic so that IDPs are not marginalized, stigmatized or discriminated against
- Communication with and support for IDP networks should be increased and IDPs should participate in decision-making
